Dec 21st is actually the first day of winter 2023.



The days are getting shorter as the month of December moves along but did you know that once December 21st arrives, our days will start to become longer.

Astronomical winter begins at the winter solstice, which is <u>the shortest day of the</u> <u>year</u>. This means days get longer during the winter---very slowly at first, but at ever-larger daily intervals as the March equinox approaches, heralding the start of spring.

Locations closer to the poles experience larger differences in day length throughout the year, so winter days are shorter there. In Calabogie, the shortest day is just under 8 hours and 56 minutes long. In Florida, it lasts about 10 hours and 32 minutes.

Places within the polar circles experience polar night during all or part of the winter season when the Sun does not rise at all.


